The property is approached over it's own covered entrance terrace with front door leading to the 756 sq ft of accommodation comprising large dual aspect living/dining room with newly refitted kitchen. There are two double bedrooms with an inner hall to bedroom two and the modern bathroom. The property has gas radiator heating (recently replaced boiler) with uPVC double glazing and an EPC rating of C. The apartment block is set back from the road and the communal gardens are well maintained, mainly laid to lawn with mature trees and shrubs. Parking is found adjacent with a covered car port and a bin storage area. Wulwyn Court is located on Edgcumbe Park which is a popular award winning development of apartments, bungalows, chalets and houses constructed by Renway Homes during the 1950's and 60's. The estate is equidistant to Crowthorne village and railway station and abuts East Berkshire golf course to the north west. Crowthorne is ideally placed with M3 & M4 access as well as local railway links and the village High Street has an array of shops, restaurants and amenities. 



