The House

The façade immediately sets the tone. A striking entrance with floor-to-ceiling glazed panels creates a dramatic first impression, complemented by cedar oak panelling to the converted garage and a distinctive feature fox statue adding personality and charm.



Upon entering, a spacious hallway with statement flooring leads through the home. A practical utility room, plumbed for both washing machine and tumble dryer, sits conveniently to one side before the house opens into its true showpiece. The heart of the home is the spectacular dual-aspect open-plan kitchen, dining and lounge area, enjoying uninterrupted views across the garden and rolling fields beyond. Ten bi-fold doors stretch across the entire width of the house, framing the landscape and flooding the space with natural light while seamlessly blending indoor and outdoor living. Underfloor heating runs throughout this entire space, enhancing both comfort and luxury. At the far end of the room is a generous boot room with side access — ideal for muddy boots after countryside walks — alongside a stylish shower room with WC facilities. Before reaching the main living area, a door from the hallway leads to a beautifully appointed family sitting room featuring wood panelling and an impressive bespoke bookcase. This in turn connects to a substantial study, large enough to accommodate a double bed, offering flexibility as an additional bedroom if required.
